Terry is a cancer survivor who endured over thirty surgical procedures in an effort to reconstruct his face, which was disfigured by a fibrosarcoma. In his latest memoir titled *At Face Value: My Triumph Over a Disfiguring Cancer* Terry relays lessons in courage and hope.
